









Come on a self drive to the extraordinary Fitzgerald River National Park, a UNESCO biosphere with 20% of WA's plant species. See stunning coastlines and new lookouts. In springtime the park is alive with unique wildflowers, like the fascinating Royal Hakea.

Wildflower Hotspots

- South Coast Hwy road verge lined with dryandra, pink kunzia, tea tree, yellow verticordia, melaleuca, damperia, lilac hibiscus, hibbertia, pouched dampera. Orchids can be found in several locations, hidden under and around bushes and trees.
- Lake King-Ravensthorpe roe's feather flower, verticordias, common cauliflower, flame grevillea.
- Archer Drive Lookout, Floater Rd - park at the lookout and explore on foot, seeing ravensthorpe bottlebrush, nodding banksia, blue leschenaultia, onesided bottlebrush, verticordia grandiflora, claw feather flower, qualup bell, pimelea physodes & pink boronia.
- Elverdton Rd a great splash of colour, bottlebrushes, dryandras, banksia nutans, qualup bells, blue leschenaultia, pink kunzia, tennis ball banksia, chittick & pink boronia.
- Railway Heritage Walk Trail information plaques about fauna and flora along the walk.
- Hopetoun East to Munglinup Beach - along Springdale Rd, Tamarin Rd, Lakes Rd displays of kangaroo paw, bell fruited mallee, red centred hibiscus, tinsel lily, large waxflower, chittick and showy banksia.
- Jerdacuttup Rd good display of Lechenaultia Formosa, Hybanthus floribundus a low upright shrub with pale blue to white flowers, fringed lily, pouched dampera, large wax flower, chittick and an A flame pea.

 Old Ongerup Rd - small section between Koornong Rd (south) & South Coast Hwy, display of Lechenaultia formosa red lechenaultia.

Fitzgerald River National Park Wildflower Hotspots

- East Mt Barren Qualup Bells, Scarlet Banksias, 4 winged Mallee, Dryandra & Coastal Foxglove flowering. Many small Qualup Bells on the East Mount Barren walk trail. The East Mount Barren Lookout over Culham Inlet has some great wildflowers and views.
- Cave Point/West Beach Rds lots of bell fruited mallees, fringed lily, poached dampiera
- Hamersley Dr large Qualup Bells between the Moir track/Quoin Head intersections. Many small Qualup Bells can be seen near the Quoin Head turnoff, great area for seasonal orchids. Large numbers of Cauliflower Hakea & Frog Hakea along the northern section of Hamersley Dr.
- There have been regular sightings of whales & dolphins along coast between Hopetoun/Bremer Bay.
